## **Metro to Hold Community Meetings throughout February for the Gold Line Eastside Transit Corridor Phase 2 Project**

The Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) will host five community meetings in February to update the community and obtain feedback on the Metro Gold Line Eastside Transit Corridor Phase 2 Project.

Metro is evaluating options to extend the Metro Gold Line east from its current terminus at Pomona and Atlantic boulevards in East Los Angeles to South El Monte and Whittier.

The five meetings will take place on:

- **Monday, February 6**, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Whittier Uptown Senior Center, 13225 Walnut Street, Whittier, CA 90602
- **Tuesday, February 7**, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Quite Cannon Spyglass Room, 901 Via San Clemente, Montebello, CA 90640
- **Wednesday, February 8**, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at South El Monte Senior Center, 1556 Central Avenue, South El Monte, CA 91733
- **Wednesday, February 15**, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Commerce Senior Citizen Center, 2555 Commerce Way, Commerce, CA 90040
- **Thursday, February 16**, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at AltaMed – Pace East Los Angeles, 5425 E. Pomona Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA 90022

The meetings will address:

- Preliminary findings regarding the Washington Boulevard north-south routing concepts (Garfield Avenue, Atlantic Boulevard and Arizona Avenue) to Whittier
- Refinements to the SR-60 Alternative to South El Monte to address comments from other agencies
- Next steps and anticipated projects milestones

The material presented at each meeting will be the same; Metro encourages members of the community to attend the meeting that is most convenient for them.
