Metro To Test Next-Generation Passenger Screening System at Los Angeles Union Station

- WHAT: The Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), in partnership with the Transportation Security Administration and Evolv Technology, will test a next-generation weapons and explosives screening system on the Metro Red Line at Union Station. The portable system can scan 600 people per hour in real time, and will automatically detect a variety of mass casualty threats. Officials will be on-hand to demonstrate the system as part of Metro's pilot project to evaluate the latest, most high-tech security technology for the Metro System.
