<u>Weekend Roundup</u> Metro Service Updates for the March 4-5 Weekend

The Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) has three service updates for the weekend of March 4 and 5.

Green Line Track Work

On Saturday, March 4, Metro will be performing track replacement work on the Metro Green Line between Aviation/LAX and Redondo Beach stations. Metro will operate shuttle buses between these two stations from opening to close of service. Trains will operate every 15 minutes. All trains traveling toward Redondo Beach Station will stop at Aviation/LAX Station and turn back toward Norwalk Station. Shuttle buses are located at street level for customers needing to complete their trips.

626 Golden Streets Event

On Sunday, March 5, Metro will operate three-car trains on the Gold Line to support L.A. County residents attending the Metro-sponsored 626 Golden Streets event between South Pasadena and Azusa. Longer trains will run on a regular Sunday schedule. Metro Operations will deploy additional personnel to Metro Gold Line Stations along the extension to Azusa to assist attendees between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Women's Day March

Those attending the Women's Day March on Sunday, March 5, at LAPD Headquarters in downtown L.A. are advised to buy TAP cards and load them with fares in advance. TAP cards are sold at all Metro Rail and Metro Orange Line Stations, at Metro Customer Centers and more than 400 outlets across L.A. County. Attendees are also encouraged to leave early to avoid potentially big crowds. The closest Metro Red/Purple Line station is Civic Center Station. Every rider must have his or her own Tap card. Regular Metro fares will apply for all attendees.
