L.A. Metro to Officially Launch New Bike Sharing System in Port of Los Angeles

WHAT:	Officials from the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), the City of Los Angeles and Bicycle Transit Systems, Inc. will officially launch Metro's innovative Bike Sharing system atr on Friday, July 14, 2017. Up to 375 bicycles and approximately 30 bike share stations will be provided throughout the Pasadena area for the first time, giving residents and visitors new active transportation options for short-distance bicycle trips to key Pasadena destinations and transit stations. Bike share stations will be available in Old Pasadena, the Rose
	Bowl, Paseo Colorado, Pasadena City College, Caltech, City Hall, the Pasadena Convention Center, shopping and restaurants on South Lake Avenue and many other locations. The celebratory event will be open to the public and will include live music, light refreshments and vendors.
