Pilot Study Underway to Test LED Real-Time Signs

The first of five LED real-time signs was installed at the bus stop shelter on Cesar E. Chavez Avenue and Vignes Street as part of a pilot study to test real-time displays at bus stops. The study will focus on the capability of the signs to update bus service information as they receive the Nextrip feed remotely. The study will also test solar-power technology at some of the locations, ADA accessibility concerns, weather exposure, and resistance to vandalism. Metro is looking forward to expanding the installation of signs at additional locations after the study is completed.
