May Day Marches Expected to Cause Bus Delays

May Day marches and rallies are expected to take place in downtown Los Angeles' central business district tomorrow Wednesday, May 1, 2013. Certain streets will begin closing between 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. The Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) will be closing and opening streets as events take place and traffic may not return to normal until after 7:00 p.m. Bus detours will be changing throughout the day and delays are expected for the lines that pass through the central business district. Metro Gate Latching

The New York Times has inquired about Metro's transition from the honor system to latched gates in the latest step in the evolution of its transit system. Project staff reported Metro has installed gates at 41 stations, including all of the Red/Purple Line and Green Line, and selected light rail stations on the Blue and Gold Lines. The agency has been conducting gate latching tests for the past year and a half, and plans to permanently latch gates this summer. Gate latching plans are just one aspect of the progress we are making to create a seamless, integrated regional transit system. The system includes other service providers with compatible fare media that can move riders easily throughout Los Angeles and Southern California. The story is expected to run tomorrow.
