Metro Transportation Research Library Wins Innovation Award

The Metro Research Library, Archives & Records Management department has been awarded the Special Library Association's Transportation Division 2013 Innovation Award. The Division, representing transportation librarians in the United States and abroad, recognizes one project, technique, tool, or practical solution each year that has improved or has the potential to improve access, dissemination, or retrieval of transportation information for stakeholders. Research Librarians Matthew Barrett and Kenn Bicknell are being honored for their Los Angeles Transportation Headlines, an aggregation of news, information and research related to transit and transportation in Southern California. The Transportation Headlines have been published since fall 2005. The Innovation Award will be presented to Matthew and Kenn at the SLA annual conference in San Diego on Saturday, June 8, 2013. Metro's predecessor, Henry E. Huntington's Los Angeles Railway and its Librarian Emma Quigley, was one of the 16 founding members of the Special Library Association's Transportation Division in 1943. Metro Featured in Guide to Los Angeles Arts & Culture

Metro is featured this month in a U.S. Airways Magazine special section, which highlights arts destinations throughout Los Angeles County and points to Metro as a means of reaching them.
