Today, the House Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee, chaired by Rep. Frank Wolf (R-VA), provided \$76 million for MOS-3 of the MTA's Red Line project in the FY 1998 Transportation Appropriations bill.

The legislation includes several contingencies in accompanying report language, including that:

- \$24 million of the \$76 million is to be set aside for use on MOS-3 Eastside Extension;
- Funding is to be withheld until the MTA has adopted a revised Rail Recovery Plan that indicates that it can fully fund its obligations under the FFGA;
- FTA, RAO and the Department of Transportation (DOT) will initially approve the Rail Recovery Plan;
- No funds will be obligated until the House Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee reviews the above and is satisfied;
- No funds will be obligated until FTA recognizes that MTA has funded the Eastside segments of the MOS-3 FFGA; and
- Additionally, the subcommittee provides \$10 million for the 3000 program and sets aside \$20 million nationwide for transit operating assistance.
