## State Economy in the Balance

California voters overwhelmingly approved the passage of key transportation bonds. The projects funded by these bonds support our economy and provide well-paying jobs. Unfortunately, chronic state budget deficits have delayed bond sales and kept many of these job-generating projects from starting. We face a daunting crisis if transportation bonds aren't sold and projects already under construction are stopped, putting thousands of people out of work.

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## Delays in transportation bond sales mean devastating effects on California's economy.

- > Transportation projects in Los Angeles County that are now under construction require state bond funding to stay in construction. Without a state budget, the State cannot sell bonds and these projects cannot be funded.
- > Jobs will be lost if the State does not adopt a budget in the very near future.
- > Projects worth billions of dollars are waiting to begin construction.
- > Metro estimates that approximately \$500 million is needed from a Fall 2011 bond sale in order to keep projects going.
- > Without a state budget, these projects cannot start and new jobs will not be created.



## Projects under construction at risk:

- > I-405 High Occupancy Vehicle Lane from I-10 to I-101
- > Exposition Light Rail Line
- > Canoga Extension of the Metro Orange Line

Projects that could start construction in 2011 may now be delayed:

- > Alameda Corridor East Grade Separation Projects
- > I-5 Widening from the Orange County Line to I-605
- > I-5 High Occupancy Vehicle Lane from Magnolia to Buena Vista Av
- > I-5/Empire Av Interchange Improvements and Railroad Grade Separation
- > SR 47/Alameda Corridor Truck Expressway between Ocean Bl and Alameda St and Replacement of the Schuyler Heim Bridge
- > Metrolink- Positive train control and sealed corridor programs
- > 78 light rail vehicles

Unemployment in Los Angeles County remains at very high levels. The construction sector is facing unemployment levels approaching 40%. So far, Metro has been able to move projects forward and create jobs using local funds. Without the State funds, however, these projects are in serious jeopardy of being shut down and workers are in jeopardy of being laid off. **Los Angeles County Share** of the Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Bond Act of 2006 (Proposition 1B) and High-Speed Passenger Train Bond Act of 2008 (Proposition 1A)
