On behalf of the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), I would like to congratulate you and Secretary LaHood on the launch of the Freight Policy Council at the U.S. Department of Transportation and to encourage our participation as advisory members of this new council. I am confident that the Freight Policy Council, which is an important result of MAP-21, will play a positive role in enhancing freight movement in the 21st Century for not only southern California, but for the nation as a whole.

As a major transportation agency situated at the epicenter of our nation's freight movement network, we understand and appreciate the potential benefits related to the creation of the Freight Policy Council. The twin ports of Los Angeles and and Long Beach, both of which are in Los Angeles County, are the first and second largest ports in North America. Taken together, these twin ports are the entry points for 40% of all imports to the United States.
