Closures for the I-5/Empire Project in Burbank

Burbank — The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) plans to implement the closures listed below during the week of May 27-31, 2014, as part of the I-5/Empire Project in Burbank. Information about the project is <u>here</u>. *Closures are subject to change*.

Residents may hear some construction noise, but it will not exceed levels permitted by state and federal regulations.

SPECIAL CLOSURE NOTES FOR THE WEEK OF MAY 27-31, 2014

- San Fernando Boulevard Closure: The half-mile segment of San Fernando Boulevard under I-5 is now CLOSED PERMANENTLY, as are the following I-5 ramps: northbound Lincoln Street off-ramp, southbound San Fernando Boulevard on-ramp, and southbound Scott Road off-ramp. Use the Buena Vista Street or Burbank Boulevard on- and offramps as alternates.
- Empire Avenue Closure: There will be a full closure of a short segment of W. Empire Avenue May 27-30, 2014, at night (9 p.m. to 6 a.m.) for utility relocation. There will be no street parking in the closure area. See map at right. More information is <u>here</u>.

Northbound I-5 Closures

May 27-31, 2014

• Up to three lanes between Olive Ave. and Hollywood Way: 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Note: The most restrictive closures (i.e., the most lanes closed) will occur between midnight and 4 a.m.

Southbound I-5 Closures

May 27-31, 2014

• Up to three lanes between Hollywood Way and Olive Ave.: 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Note: The most restrictive closures (i.e., the most lanes closed) will occur between midnight and 4 a.m.

For the safety of the construction crew and motorists, please be attentive to closures, slow for the cone zone, and move over one lane where possible.
