The 2009 Ventura County Fair offers “Purebred and Home Grown” fun starting August 5, with homegrown transportation courtesy of Metrolink.

Special Ventura County Line charter trains will deliver fairgoers to cool summer merriment at Seaside Park, including great tastes, thrills, and entertainment. Trains will run between Chatsworth and the Ventura County Fairgrounds at Seaside Park on Saturdays and Sundays during the fair, which runs Wednesday, August 5, through Sunday, August 16.

The 2009 Ventura County Fair has amazing entertainment lined up to keep homegrown and transplanted Californians rocking along! Featured artists include Gretchen Wilson, Good Charlotte, Rick Springfield, Lee Ann Womack, and Huey Lewis and The News. The Ultimate Doo Wop Show will have you humming a tune all the way home, and motorsport excitement is sure to keep your heart racing and your head spinning.

Metrolink fair service is a special charter offered by the Ventura County Transportation Commission in cooperation with Seaside Park. Special tickets are required to ride the special trains. Purchase tickets in advance, Mondays through Fridays, at the Whistle Stop Coffee Depot in the Chatsworth Station or the Simi Valley, Moorpark, and Camarillo city halls. Tickets also may be purchased on the day of travel at train stations on a first-come, first-served basis.

Charter-train tickets range from \$4 to \$6 one way and \$8 to \$12 round trip. Children ages five or younger ride free. Metrolink monthly passes from any line also will be accepted. Rules of the Road: Service Animals and Pets

Metrolink's very diverse passenger population includes pets and service animals. To ensure all passengers have a safe, comfortable, and reliable commute, we have specific rules for pets and service animals, and our conductors and sheriff's deputies have been specially trained to enforce them.

Service animals are always welcome on Metrolink. Passengers with disabilities and service animals may ride anywhere on the train as long as the animals remain under the passenger's control and do not threaten the safety of fellow riders. Service animals have been individually trained to perform specific tasks for persons with disabilities. Metrolink personnel may ask passengers what tasks their animals are trained to perform, to determine that they are service animals.

Orange County Line rider Lucia Gobel Vega, who is blind, has commuted from Tustin to Norwalk on Metrolink for three years. She currently travels with her guide dog, a standard poodle named Jolie (pictured).

Vega, a clinical social worker at the Metropolitan State Hospital who lives with her husband in Irvine, asks that fellow riders not approach or pet Jolie. When a service dog is in a harness, the dog is working. If Jolie is distracted, even for a brief moment, she won't be watching out for Vega.

As a reminder, pets may travel on Metrolink trains as long as they are confined to approved, ventilated pet carriers that fit on a passenger's lap or under a seat.

All Metrolink policies comply with federal regulations regarding accessible public transit. Ongoing training for conductors and law-enforcement personnel ensures that we remain sensitive to the needs of all passengers, including those with service animals. Rail 2 Rail Changes Effective This Month

Amtrak one-way and round-trip tickets will no longer be accepted on most Metrolink trains, effective August 1, 2009.

The only exception is that all Amtrak and all Metrolink ticket types will continue to be accepted on Metrolink and Amtrak trains between Burbank Airport and Los Angeles Union Station. This includes shared-service trains Metrolink Train 158/Amtrak Train 768 and Metrolink Train 153 /Amtrak Train 799.



SAFETY MATTERS: EXITING COMET

You may have noticed the addition of several leased Utah Transit Authority Comet cars on some train sets. These older cars are not double-deckers, are not accessible to the disabled, and have a different seating configuration from our other passenger cars.

With the addition of this differently configured equipment, it is important to familiarize yourself with the emergency-evacuation poster located in every passenger car. Comet-car evacuation procedures differ from those of our newer cars.

If you are riding in a Comet car and an emergency occurs, follow this procedure:

- Always listen to your conductor's instructions.
- Remain in place unless instructed to evacuate.
- Please assist fellow passengers in need of help.
- Remember to leave bicycles, wheelchairs, and other bulky items behind.
- Evacuate to an adjacent car if one is accessible.
- If an adjacent car is not accessible (or you are instructed to do so), exit through regular train doors or through emergency windows.

UPLAND'S DELI V BAKERY CAFÉ

You'd never guess it by the unfussy, down-to-earth feel of her restaurant, but there's an internationally renowned chef cooking just steps from the Metrolink station in historic downtown Upland.

Most days, Deli V Bakery Café serves classic American deli fare—soups, salads, and cold sandwiches plus hot panini and pasta. Every Thursday, patrons get a surprise international special. The offerings change weekly—from British shepherd's pie to Indian curry to Italian risotto.

Such gastronomic diversity is a habit for co-owner and head chef Visa Lam, an immigrant from Singapore who became a U.S. citizen last year. Back in Singapore, Lam ran a restaurant that served Chinese, Indian, Malay, and American food. She first learned to cook from her dad, an army cook, and later did a stint in a Cordon Bleu culinary school. Lam even once catered a luncheon for Singapore's prime minister. These days, Lam prides herself on offering freshly baked bread and "soul-warming" soup made from scratch daily at Deli V.

Somewhere between a formal restaurant and a fast-food joint, Deli V is a cozy spot that serves healthy food in short order. That's one of many reasons regulars keep coming back. Deli V—the V is for Visa—also is popular with locals because the restaurant contributes to local organizations like the YMCA.

In addition to breakfast, lunch, and dinner, Deli V offers freshly baked pies and custom cakes plus an espresso and coffee bar. Deli

EXIT CARS IN AN EMERGENCY

To exit through regular train doors, follow this procedure:

- Break plastic covering over emergency handle.
- Pull the red ring down.
- Grip side of door, then slide open.
- Exit train with caution.

To exit through the emergency windows, follow this procedure:

- Pull the red handles toward you to remove strip.
- Pull the window toward you using both handles.
- Windows weigh 19 pounds, so please remove carefully.
- Place window inside train.
- Exit train with caution.
