

A TRIBUTE TO VICTORY - AND YOU

Los Angeles has witnessed many pageants in the past. We have paid tribute on a grand scale to the heroes of many wars, when they returned. Parades and bands and marching soldiers have received the cheers of our grateful citizens.

Now another pageant is being planned. A day for saluting. A day for paying tribute. A day known and long to be remembered as "Tribute To Victory" Day.

It is a fitting coincidence that this day falls on Navy Day, October 27. It also marks the opening of the Victory Loan Drive—the final War Bond drive.

On this day we also have the opportunity of paying tribute to all who contributed to the final victory. Not only to our valiant armed forces, but to the soldiers of the home front—you citizens of Los Angeles and your neighbors all over the nation.

In pageantry, the whole story of *your* efforts will be told.

The story of the defense workers as well as the story of the Marines on Iwo Jima. The story of the women who rolled bandages or worked in a canteen. The story of the blood donors. The story of all America united.

The pageant starts with a tremendous four column, two hour parade beginning at 10:30 a.m. Highlights of the parade will in-

clude marching units from the cruiser, *Los Angeles*, and from the carrier, *Shangri La*, Sherman tanks, anti-aircraft guns, plus dozens of Army, Navy and civilian bands.

There also will be thousands of representatives of civilian volunteer organizations, veterans' organizations, representatives of labor unions and all the others who contributed so much.

At the conclusion of the parade, a vast armada of Army and Navy bombers and fighters will fly over the city.

The spotlight will then swing to Los Angeles Harbor for a Navy Day celebration where ships of the Third Fleet will be open for inspection.

The climax of the "Tribute To Victory" Day will be a gigantic illuminated spectacle, "The Colossus of the Coliseum," beginning at 7:00 p.m. You will see, free of charge, an authentic chapter of history in the fall of Corregidor. You will hear the

last message which was sent to America before the surrender. You will witness a re-enactment of the surrender scene on the deck of the *Missouri*, the attack of Kamikaze planes on the deck of a carrier, and the fire bombing of Tokyo with B-29's soaring low overhead.

TRANSPORTATION REROUTING FOR "TRIBUTE TO VICTORY" PARADE

Because of the "Tribute To Victory" parade which begins at 10:30 a.m.,

Saturday, October 27, it is necessary to reroute the lines which ordinarily operate on Broadway and to cut some lines on streets crossing Broadway.

The "5" line will turn at Sunset to Main; down Main to its regular route at Eleventh and Main.

The "P" line will operate down First Street to Spring; south on Spring to Main; Main to Eleventh; Eleventh to Figueroa; down Figueroa to its regular route at Pico and Figueroa.

The "W" line will operate down Broadway to Temple; Temple to Hill; south on Hill to its regular route at Eleventh and Hill.

The "9" line will operate the same route as the "W" line, west on Eleventh to Grand; south on Grand to the regular route at Pico and Grand.

The "U" and "D" lines will turn back at Fifth and Flower; and at Fifth and Wall. Patrons using these lines will be given transfers and allowed the privilege of walking over from Fifth and Flower to Fifth and Wall, or vice versa.

The "R," "S" and "H" lines will turn back at Seventh and Los Angeles and at Seventh and Hope. Walkover transfers will also be permitted on these lines.

The "N" line will turn back at Ninth and Hope and at Fourteenth and Main to the Union Station.

The "3," "J" and "P" lines will be permitted to cut through breaks in the parade.
