NO. 1544 TO TRAVEL TOWN

As PE's third gift to Travel Town, Freight Locomotive No. 1544 this month is being turned over to the transportation display in Griffith Park. This historic electric engine ran up and down Market Street hauling away debris and bringing in emergency supplies following the San Francisco earthquake and fire of 1906. Later it pulled the dirt trains as Pacific Electric excavated for its downtown subway tunnel in 1925. Now it joins the old Sierra Vista Station and Express Car No. 1498 as the company's gift to the children of Southern California.

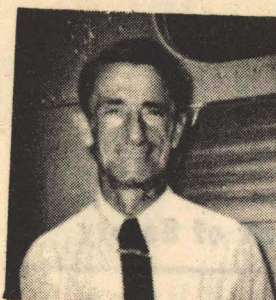
