

U.N. Completes Agenda, Halts Hungary Checkups

Zorin, Adlai Map Press Meetings

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The General Assembly closed the door just after midnight on a session overshadowed by the threat of nuclear war over Cuba and an undeclared war between India and Red China.

U.S. Ambassador Adlai E. Stevenson and Soviet chief delegate Valerian A. Zorin called news conferences today to deliver post-mortems on the session where offstage action often stole the spotlight from the debate.

In the final hours before adjournment the 116-nation group abolished its one-man watchdog mission for Hungary, a move which will eliminate the annual report on conditions in the Soviet satellite and probably shelved debate indefinitely on that cold war item.

Yemen Rebels Backed
The assembly recognized the revolutionary republican government of Yemen and unseated the rival royalist delegation. The vote was 74-4 with 23 nations abstaining.

The United States dropped its controversial plan for U.N. inspection of conditions in the Portuguese colony of Angola after African and Asian delegates protested that the plan might weaken an earlier assembly call for sanctions against Portugal.

The assembly also authorized Secretary-General U Thant to spend up to \$10 million a month in the Congo and \$1.35 million in the Middle East to keep forces in the field until June 30. It also gave him authority to call a special session of the assembly next spring to deal with the Congo finance problem.

Extended for two more years the life of the U.N. Works and Relief Agency for Palestine refugees.

Noted a report from the 17-nation disarmament committee that its general negotiations had failed to produce an agreement on a nuclear test ban to take effect by Jan. 1.

Wading through the heaviest agenda in its history, the assembly wound up a day ahead of its deadline. This was a triumph for assembly President Muhammad Zafrulla Khan of Pakistan, who rode herd on long-winded speakers and tardy delegates all through the session.

SM City Hall, Other Offices Get 2 Days Off

The Santa Monica City Hall will be closed both Monday and Tuesday for the Christmas holidays.

Courts and the county building will be open on Monday, but will be closed Tuesday.

City employees customarily receive half-holidays on the eve of Christmas and New Year's, but the City Council changed the regulations this year so they would have the full day off Monday and work the full day on New Year's Eve.

Then they also were given the day off on New Year's Eve when Gov. Edmund Brown proclaimed the day "California First Day" to call attention to California's growth into the nation's largest state.

Trash collections will be made as usual on both Mondays, but will not be made on Christmas or New Year's.

SD Freeway

Brown declared that the 5½ miles of freeway through the Santa Monica Mountains will save nine lives next year.

"By next summer," Brown continued, "we will have the San Diego Freeway in operation all the way from U.S. 98 at San Fernando to Long Beach—and these 40 miles of freeway will save 40 lives next year."

Speakers Listed
Other speakers at the opening, which was led by a Los Angeles City Fire Department helicopter carrying Mayor Sam Yorty, included Chairman Warren Born of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Yorty, Metropolitan District Highway Engineer E. T. Telford, retiring Assemblyman Harold Levering, State Sen-elect Thomas Rees and Los Angeles Councilman Karl Rundberg.

Levering, R - Santa Monica, West Los Angeles, carried the fight for the freeway in the legislature.

"I'm very glad to get this job over before I leave public office," Levering commented.

product of any of their six meetings. It was believed France already has been invited to accept Polaris weapons under the same set of conditions.

No French decision has been reached, however.

The earliest date at which Britain could begin buying American-made Polaris missiles would be 1970, since no specially equipped submarines could be built before then. Britain will pay for all missiles supplied but will not share U.S. development costs of \$2.5 billion.

British Have Warheads

The British will furnish their own Polaris warheads.

Both the United States and Britain placed one condition on their commitment of nuclear forces to NATO. The two countries reserved the right to employ independently bombers and Polaris submarines assigned to NATO, in the case involving "supreme national interests."

The agreement represented a long step toward the solution of two problems which have plagued the two countries for many months.

—To give Britain an acceptable substitute for the now discarded Skybolt nuclear missile which would have been launched from Britain's Vulcan bombers. Macmillan insisted that Britain need not preserve her status as a front-rank world power.

—It marked a first step toward possible resolution of the problem of Western European nations developing independent nuclear forces.

The Nassau agreement provides a framework under which France, Britain and other Western Allies can pool their nuclear punch under common direction.

Conventional Upgrading
A secondary feature of the agreement was a resolution that both leaders are of one mind "on the importance of increasing the effectiveness of their conventional forces on a worldwide basis."

Something the United States has been seeking.

The agreement, as announced, was one of three ideas discussed by the British and American leaders in their talks at secluded Lyford Cay.

she was first smothered with the bedclothes, and then beaten on the head with a heavy object. She was wearing a green plaid skirt and a large blouse, officers said.

She was also wearing two silver bracelets, a silver ring and a necklace, detectives reported.

No money and no jewelry—other than that which Mrs. Howell had been wearing—was found in the apartment. However, a coin purse containing \$10 in cash was discovered by officers today.

No murder weapon was found, police said.

Bloody Towels Found
A trash barrel containing several bloody paper towels was discovered by police who searched the alley behind the apartment building.

Mrs. Cowles told police Mrs. Howell was "apparently wealthy." She said she had paid \$200 rent in cash for two months, on Nov. 24.

"At that time she had a stack of bills about an inch thick," Mrs. Cowles told officers. The murder that sent Cowles woman was also known to occurring into the 3
