COUNTY-WIDE COMPLIANCE  
FOR UMTA TITLE VI CIVIL RIGHTS REGULATIONS

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## INTRODUCTION

The intent of the civil rights act was to insure equality of opportunity for all persons regardless of any physical, cultural or other sociological differences. Public transportation, itself a basic necessity measurable in terms of equity, has the added responsibility of influencing the equality of opportunity of persons in the area in their quest for the other basic life necessities. In keeping with the intent of the civil rights act and subsequent measures, therefore, UMTA has requested all transit agencies to submit a comprehensive study of their operations as they pertain to equity of service and equality of opportunity within their territories.

Insofar as the Title VI requirements are concerned, service equity is measured by items such as vehicle load factors, bus assignments and various procedural and policy statements which are generated from in-house data. As different approaches are used in preparing these service equity measures due to differences in data formats, etc., in each transit district, this paper will be limited to discussion of the UMTA Title VI requirements which deal with external data that can be used by all transit districts in the area. The two Title VI requirements which are based on external data sources are the Profile of the Service Area and the Accessibility Comparison Survey.

## PROFILE OF THE SERVICE AREA

This section of the submittal provides UMTA with an overview (graphic and tabular) of the demographic make up of the County.

### Definition of Terms

The Service Area There are a number of reasons for defining the service area as coterminous with Los Angeles County boundaries:

- a) The complex intermingling of bus lines make the definition of some areas as exclusively RTD's or exclusively muni's impossible.
- b) RTD lines extending beyond County boundaries are there by virtue of special contracts and are a minor part of the service in those counties.
- c) Caltrans had completed their zone to zone bus time tables for the County as a whole and had included all lines of any transit district crossing the boundary of a Traffic Analysis Zone.
- d) Demographic and economic data were readily available for the County as a whole.

Minority UMTA has defined four groups that are to be examined with regards to equity in transit: Blacks, not of Spanish origin; Hispanics: Asians or Pacific Islanders: and American Indians or Alaskan Natives. In the RTD submittal, any data or definitions dealing with Blacks included persons of Spanish origin. Because the data labeled "Negroes" in the 1970 Census is based on 100% count of self-definition question, and the data dealing with Hispanics is based on a 25% sample of a number of items that may or may not add to UMTA's intended definition of a Hispanic, no attempt was made to crosstab and remove Hispanics from the data containing Blacks. The "Hispanics" data used throughout the submittal combines "Persons of Spanish Language" and "Persons of Spanish Surname" from the Census. The first statistic is based on a question dealing with "mother tongue" and the second is a product of the Census Bureau's list of Spanish surnames. Having separately defined the surnames that were considered Spanish, they tallied those out of the 25% sample excluding those persons who had indicated Spanish as their mother tongue.

#### Data Availability

All population and demographic data are based on the 1960 and 1970 Census of Population and Housing. Although evidence exists that a major shift in racial/ethnic group location has taken place since 1970, special mid-decade Censuses were not taken universally throughout the County. Also detail levels varied from one of these mid-decade Censuses to another according to the needs of the contracting city: so that no reliable estimates of the required groups to be examined could be made for small areas.

#### The Profile Maps

Maps showing the following items area required as part of the Title VI Submittal:

- a) Major streets and highways, cities and points of interest
- b) Bus routes
- c) Black minority zones
- d) Hispanic minority zones
- e) Asian and Pacific Islander minority zones
- f) American Indian (including Alaskan natives) minority zones
- g) Low income zones
- h) No-car household zones
- i) Transit district fixed facilities' locations
- j) Location of activity centers

SCAG has submitted the maps 'a' through 'h' to UMTA and they recently have been approved by the UMTA Office of Civil Rights for use in our Title VI Submittal. Map requirements 'i' and 'j' above, have been completed by RTD as overlays to register with the SCAG maps. It is our belief that they will fulfill the Title VI mapping requirements for all County transit districts.

The Fixed Facility overlay contains all of the transit headquarters, divisions, maintenance yards, etc. in the County including those of the other districts. The Activity Centers map includes all of the centers required for the accessibility comparisons survey except employment centers.

Employment was plotted on a separate overlay because the data was for Census Tracts and warranted a separate graphic treatment. It was based on the 1973 Industrial and Commercial Employment Study conducted by the State of California and the County of Los Angeles. The map shows only those Census Tracts with total employment of 5,000 or more as shaded areas. No attempt was made to normalize the data for the size of the Census Tract. Thus the map does not show the density of employment. It shows only areas with large numbers of employment. Copies of these maps are available for your examination any time in RTD's Planning Department.

#### ACCESSIBILITY COMPARISON SURVEY

The final product of this part of the submittal is the table on page 40. This table is the product of three large data banks and procedures including a set of complex computer programs. The data in the table must be read in two different ways. The employment data is the percent of the total County employment that can be reached on the average from the noted zone type. For instance, the percent of total County employment that can be accessed by bus within 60 minutes of Black minority zones ranges from 3.42% to 55.45%, depending on the zone examined. The percent of total employment accessible from all the Black minority zones is 35.27% on the average.

The rest of the table deals with percentages of minority populations within all designated minority zones. The percents shown under the Black minority zone category for example, indicate the percent of total Blacks in all Black minority zones that have access to the particular activity center within the standard travel time by bus.

#### Data Base #1: Demographic Variables

Caltrans contributed their expertise to this major data bank by not only supplying computer tapes of the 1970 Census but also by providing us with their 1976 estimates of total employment by Traffic Analysis Zone. It was from these estimates that the employment accessible from each of the minority zones was calculated.

Following UMTA's guidelines, we have defined the basis data unit for the accessibility comparison survey as follows:

Minority Zone A Traffic Analysis Zone having greater than the County average of one or another minority population. Caltrans has defined 771 Traffic Analysis Zones in the County. Since these are Census Tracts or multiples of Census Tracts, census data is easily compiled for these Zones.

### Bus Travel Time Network

Caltrans was the sole participant in preparing a County-wide bus travel time network. The basis of the network is the concept that by breaking the area down into zones, and assuming that on the average all trips from one zone to another originate and end at the centroid of each zone, resulting zone to zone travel time estimates will give us a fair representation of actual trip times throughout the area. It provides a matrix of travel times from each of the 771 Traffic Analysis Zones in the County to each of the others. It represents all possible trip combinations and it provides us with the basis of comparing travel times of one group of zones to an activity center, against another group of zones to that same activity center. The UTPS program package was used to generate this network.

### Activity Centers

Lists of the required activity centers to be used as measures of accessibility were obtained from a number of different sources (please see Appendix). In as much as possible, UMTA definitions of what constituted an activity center were adhered to. However, in some cases data was just not readily available on a region-wide basis and some poetic license was taken. In all cases except for the list of police stations, some quantitative measure of size or volume indicative of the center's importance as a trip generator was included in the data.

In the case of shopping centers, UMTA requested that we use both "community shopping centers" and regional shopping centers with 500,000+ square feet. Instead, we used U.S. Census Bureau lists of "Major Retail Centers" consisting of at least one general merchandize store of 100,000+ square feet and 25 or more contiguous stores. Quantitative data on employment and sales for these centers will be available early next year.

Two categories of activity centers were listed by UMTA under a "medical" heading: public hospitals and outpatient clinics. Since many of the private hospitals in Los Angeles contain clinic facilities and since MediCal and the HMOs in this region enable low income persons to use private facilities, hospitals with 150 or more beds were considered to be more in keeping with the intent of the measurement standard.

Social service welfare offices and food stamp offices are one and the same in Los Angeles County. The persons served by each of these offices and functions are included in the data lists. Although UMTA's circular called for inclusion of only night schools and community colleges under the education heading, our listing includes both continuation and adult high schools regardless of the time of day they function, as well as community colleges.

Enrollment statistics are included in those data lists. The UMTA circular designated the Central Business District an activity center. Only the Los Angeles CBD has been defined for use in the accessibility comparison survey in this submittal.

### Problems

It is quite possible to take issue with most of the definitions and some of the logic in the accessibility comparison survey. For instance, the definitions of the minority groups to be measured, irrespective of problems obtaining data, do not make sense in all instances. It is evident that some regional input regarding what constitutes a minority should have been obtained by UMTA prior to defining the final groupings. The lumping together of several groups under one heading for examination in terms of accessibility may dampen evidence of discrimination against one group. The percentage Indians are of total population is so small (.3%) and so well distributed throughout the County that it defies any standard definition of a minority. The definition of minority zones is questionable also in that it lacks an additional dimension measuring the amount of geographic concentration. In addition, we found some of the activity centers used as criteria for accessibility to be, well...unbelievable. Are police stations really measures of transit equity?

In general it seemed that UMTA was on a fishing expedition this first time out. It should be noted that the definitional problems if anything have enhanced the very favorable picture of Los Angeles regional transit with regards to the equity question. It is evident that even with more stringent definitions the area would appear to provide equitable service. However, hopefully UMTA will accept input from the individual transit properties for modification of definitions for subsequent Title VI submissions.

### SUMMARY

It is hoped that the input and methodology used by RTD for these portions of their submittal can be adapted to suit other districts' submittal needs this year. It is also hoped that the exercise we have gone through will provide the basis for the various blanket agencies (SCAG, LACTC, Caltrans) to systematize future Title VI work programs. Section 9 funding should be provided so that each of these agencies can take responsibility for certain segments of an annual region wide Title VI submittal.

It would appear that LACTC should be the coordinating and administering arm of such a joint venture. SCAG could most logically generate and keep current the data lists dealing with activity centers as well as the regional transit system map. Caltrans could continue to provide computer expertise in the generation of travel times and could obtain the Metropolitan Accessibility Program package from UMTA. Each of these functions would seem to fit in with the general scope of these agencies' other endeavors.

## 1. Summary

The Southern California Rapid Transit District hereby submits "Title VI" information to the Urban Mass Transportation Administration as required by Chapter 2, Circular 1160.1.

We are confident that the information contained herein will be more than sufficient for an immediate finding of compliance.

Service area profile maps and service maps are presented for Los Angeles County, including the areas primarily served by local municipal lines rather than only SCRTD. Several features become apparent on examination of the maps:

- o Much of the County's area is defined as minority territory, not only due to the relatively wide dispersal of minority residents throughout the area, but also due to UMTA's definition of what constitutes a "minority zone", namely -- any zone having a percentage of minority residents equal to or greater than the county average.
- o Many of SCRTD's lines are quite long and, therefore, serve both minority and non-minority areas. In fact, all but two of the District's lines are "minority lines" in the sense that they traverse and serve areas defined as "minority zones".
- o Most types of activity centers are uniformly distributed throughout the region. Exceptions are the CBD, employment concentrations and social service offices.

These definitional findings have some bearing on the outcome of the analysis dealing with vehicle assignments, load factors, and accessibility. As the fleet age indicates, many of the

vehicles do not have such amenities as air-conditioning or bucket seats. Also, their distribution is based on non-random factors such as topographical and temperature variations from subarea to subarea as well as fuel and speed limitations affecting their use on long-distance routes. The variance in age, amenities or load factors from one geographical set of lines to another, therefore, reflects physical constraints and is non-discriminatory. The activity center categories having highest variance in accessibility from group to group reflect distance factors rather than discriminatory practices.

In summary, SCRTD believes that the findings herein confirm SCRTD's compliance with Title VI standards. These findings are summarized below.

The benefits and services of SCRTD are made available to, and are fairly and adequately distributed among, beneficiaries without regard to race, color, or national origin.

- o Buses servicing various groups are distributed without discrimination as to age and comfort features.
- o Proportions of bus lines having high load factors do not vary significantly among racial/ethnic groups.
- o Proportions of bus lines having low load factors do not vary significantly from group to group.

Location of existing or proposed facilities and the provision of transit services do not deny access to any person on the basis of prohibited discrimination.

- o All groups measured have similar accessibility to activity centers which are uniformly distributed geographically.



- o Of the 205 SCRTD lines, 196 serve American Indians and Alaskan Natives; 107 serve Blacks; 178 serve Hispanics; 166 serve Asians or Pacific Islanders.

Persons in the affected community are not differentially or adversely impacted on the basis of race, color, or national origin.

- o Fixed facilities such as operating divisions, maintenance yards, etc., are located so as not to disadvantage one group more than another.

The opportunity and ability of persons to participate in transit planning, programming and implementation is not limited on the basis of race, color, or national origin.

- o The District actively solicits input and feedback from all groups regardless of race, color, or national origin.

2. Profile of the Service Area

The following data are for all of Los Angeles County and come from the 1970 Census of Population and Housing (with some numbers from the 1960 census).

g. Profile Maps

The base map and the overlays showing the location of minority, low-income, and low-auto-ownership traffic analysis zones were submitted by the Southern California Association of Governments in connection with their Section 9 submittal for Title VI. Those maps are hereby incorporated by reference. Overlays showing the locations of concentrations of employment, major activity centers, and District and municipal lines' facilities are furnished in a separate package as part of this submittal for Sections 3 and 5.

e. Accessibility Provided by the Service

Accessibility was analyzed using the Metropolitan Accessibility Program (MAP) and Caltrans' Traffic Analysis Zone definitions as the basic data unit. In all cases, the comparison is between zones having a percent of minority population for any of the four minorities in excess of the county average (access for each type of minority is listed separately) and those zones which do not have any minority population in excess of the county average.

The data utilized to calculate the travel times between zones were generated from the Urban Transportation Planning System (UTPS) programs dealing with bus mode network timetables. These network timetables include both SCRTD bus lines and Municipal bus lines that cross the Traffic Analysis Zone boundaries. The transit network that existed in 1976 was used because it had already been coded by LARTS.

Employment data are place-of-work estimates made by Caltrans based on a variety of sources including on-going surveys. No listing of community shopping centers as defined in the Circular 1160.1 is available for Los Angeles County. Major retail centers as defined for this analysis, therefore, include all areas having one or more general merchandise store of at least 100,000 square feet in size, plus at least 25 contiguous stores.

The medical center analysis includes all hospitals with 150 or more beds in the County. No listing of outpatient clinics was available on a consolidated basis. However, since most clinics are located in hospitals, the same listing of hospitals was analyzed for access within both the 60-minute time band and the 30-minute time band. Similarly, food stamp and welfare offices are collocated in Los Angeles. Hence, there is only one listing for this under a "social service" category.

The average fare comparison is omitted from the summary table since the District base in 1976 (35¢) applied uniformly across the service area. The municipal operators supply such a small portion of the area's service that an attempt to calculate the fare for two-carrier trips would have been meaningless in terms of overall area-wide access to the various attractors.

The methodology employed by MAP assumes a certain amount of uniformity in the dispersal of the various attractors throughout the service area. This uniformity precludes travel time/accessibility comparison distortions due to distance factors which are beyond the control of transit operators. As supported by the Accessibility Comparison Summary Table shown below and the Activity Center Map provided to UMTA by SCRTD, most attractors measured in this report are fairly uniformly dispersed throughout the area; and bus service to them from all Traffic Analysis Zones regardless of minority or majority population content, is equitable.

However, three categories of trip attractors being used as a measure of equity in bus service in Los Angeles deserve special attention. In each case, their dispersal throughout the service area is not uniform, either simply by definition or due to economic considerations.

The CBD in Los Angeles is centrally located and various civic offices located there serve the 1400+ square mile service area of public transit in Los Angeles County, including densely populated areas 30 miles to the east, 22 miles to the south and 25 miles to the northwest. The greatest densities in employment in Los Angeles are in the CBD and areas close by to the southeast and to the west. Social service offices have been located where they are most needed. In each of these cases, the measurement of accessibility shown in the table below more closely reflects the location of the attractor than bus service.

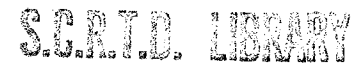
