Circulation of the Proposed Negative Declaration and the Environmental Assessment/Initial Study For Metro Rail Project Minimum Operable Segment -1 (MOS-1) Realignment between the Civic Center Station and the Yard and Shops

Attached is a copy of the proposed Negative Declaration and the Environmental Assessment/Initial Study (EA/IS) for the proposed realignment of a segment of the Metro Rail Project MOS-1, from the Civic Center Station in downtown Los Angeles to the Yard and Shops near Union Station.

This realignment has been proposed to avoid contaminated soil found under the current approved alignment, thereby reducing the health and safety impacts of the current alignment. The proposed realignment will also reduce the capital construction costs and improve schedule adherence for completion of the MOS-1 Metro Rail Project.

This EA/IS has been prepared because the proposed realignment was not previously examined in the Metro Rail Final Environmental Impact Statement published in 1983 or the Metro Rail Project MOS-1 Environmental Assessment published in 1984.

Comments on the above documents are being solicited during a 30-day comment period which will close on August 21, 1987. Please submit written comments to Mr. Nadeem Tahir, Manager, Environmental Engineering, Southern California Rapid Transit District, 425 So. Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90013.

The Proposed Project:

The proposed project is to realign a segment of the Metro Rail Project MOS-1 from the Civic Center Station in downtown Los Angeles to the Yard and Shops near Union Station. This realignment which shifts the current alignment from approximately 50 to 400 feet south westerly of its present location is proposed to avoid contaminated soil found in the path of the current alignment. The proposed project is described in detail on Page 6 of the Environmental Assessment/Initial Study.

Project Description The proposed project is to realign a and Location: segment of the Metro Rail Project MOS-1 from the Civic Center Station in downtown Los Angeles to the Yard and Shops near Union Station. This realignment which shifts the current alignment from approximately 50 to 400 feet south westerly of its present location is proposed to avoid contaminated soil found in the path of the current alignment. The alignment location of the current approved Metro Rail MOS-1 Project is shown in attached Figure A and the proposed realignment project location is shown in attached Figure B. The proposed project is also described in detail on Page 6 in Section 3 of the Environmental Assessment/Initial Study (EA/IS) prepared for this Project.

Project Proponent: Southern California Rapid Transit District

Statement of Findings: The EA/IS prepared for this proposed realignment project indicates that the proposed realignment project will not involve significant additional adverse impacts other than those caused by the current approved alignment which are described in the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) published in December 1983 and the Environmental Assessment (EA) published in August 1984. The proposed realignment will reduce the health and safety impacts due to avoidance of contaminated soil found under the current alignment. The proposed realignment project includes the following mitigation measures which are contained in the EA/IS completed in July 1987. These mitigation measures would also apply to the current approved alignment but have been highlighted here because of their significance.

Mitigation Measures

Impact Area

Water Quality: In accordance with the requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit, a treatment plant will be installed to treat pumped out groundwater. This groundwater contains sulfides in concentrations sufficient to cause odor problems and potential health problems. The treatment process consists of adding sodium hydroxide to raise the extracted groundwater pH, addition of a hydrogen peroxide solution to convert the sulfides to sulfate, addition of sulfuric acid to lower the pH, treatment with granular activated carbon to remove oil and organic compounds, and discharge to surface waters. For more detail, see Pages 23 and 24 of the EA/IS.

Hazardous Materials: Any contaminated soils or other contaminants uncovered during construction will be removed and transported to a Class I disposal facility in accordance with Federal and State environmental requirements and in coordination with the California Department of Health Services. For more details, see Page 26 of the EA/IS.

Other Impacts Other mitigations for land acquisition and displacements, transportation, construction, cultural resources etc.; are included in the EA/IS for the Metro Rail Project MOS-1 Realignment between the Civic Center Station and the Yard and Shops near Union Station completed in July, 1987, in the 1983 FEIS for the Metro Rail Project and the 1984 EA for the MOS-1 Project, and are adopted by reference.
