I. CONSTRUCTION MANAGER'S SUMMARY STATEMENT

MAJOR CM ACTIVITIES

This Contract Performance Report (CPR) for the month of September 1987 is the third CPR in the Fourth Annual Work Plan (4th AWP) and covers the period August 29 through September 25, 1987.

CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS: Continued to provide construction management services for Contracts A-121, A-141, A-145, A-146, A-161, A-171 and A-175. Continued to monitor utilities relocation work in association with construction activities. Reviewed submittals for utility, traffic and environmental controls requirements. Continued site layout preparation, technical coordination, and review for A-141 groundwater treatment facilities. Conducted water quality review and monitoring. Monitored soil contamination in A-141 and A-146. Conducted asbestos investigations at A-145 and A-146 and prepared findings and instructions for removal.

PROJECT CONTROLS: Reviewed A-141 Contractor Part II Schedule resubmittal and A-175 Contractor Part I Schedule submittal. Processed Change Orders for A-121 (CO-001, CO-002 and CO-005), A-141 (CO-004, CO-008 and CO-009), A-145 (CO-003) and A-161 (CO-005, CO-006 and CO-007). Processed Change Requests A-121 (CR-016), A-141 (CR-018), A-145 (CR-015, CR-016), A-161 (CR-025) and A-175 (CR-003). Calculated Liquidated Damage Values associated with 45 Day Window Report. Submitted claims logs for A-121, A-141, A-145, A-146, A-161, A-165 and A-175. Reevaluated estimates on A-145, CR-004 and CR-009. Prepared evaluation of RTD's estimate on A-121, CR-008 and CR-010. Continued A-141, CR-000 and CR-001 estimate analysis. Prepared preliminary estimate on A-171 CR-001. Prepared Construction Impact Study of Sunset Blvd., Aerial, Cut and Cover and Tunnel to support RTD environmental hearings. Summarized A-145 Part II Schedule submittal and impact to the MOS-1 Level III Construction Schedule. Revised method for budgeting, reporting and control of General Condition Items associated with 4th AWP. Prepared input for Rev. 5D Schedule and conducted a schedule analysis. Revised the "Construction Cost Performance and Construction Progress Curves" based on Financial Plan - Rev. 5C dated 8/13/87.

CONTRACTS/PROCUREMENT: Continued support activities for equipment to be purchased by A-141 contractor for water treatment plant. Assisted RTD in evaluation of bids for construction of Main Shop Building, Contract A-112 by obtaining supplemental information on low bidder. Initiated commercial and technical evaluation of proposals for Water Leak Survey and Rodent and Pest Control Services subcontracts. Submitted for RTD approval Amendment No. 1 to Subcontract with Kennedy/Jenks/Chilton for completion of design engineering of Water Treatment Plant. Submitted all remaining amendments to Associate Subcontracts and Consultant Agreements to RTD for approval of 4th AWP requirements. Submitted recommendation for award to RTD of purchase order for

additional office copier for PDCD central office. Issued one Amendment to Associate Subcontractor for AWP-4 requirements as approved by RTD.

ENGINEERING SERVICES: Reviewed and submitted comments on draft addendum for Contract A-135 Union Station and Contract A-610/A-115 Trackwork and Yard Area bid documents. Started spot checking and logging A-145 soldier pile holes. Reviewed Contractor claim for an extra due to striking hard cemented sandstone layers in the soldier pile holes penetrating the soft bedrock of Civic Center Station. Reviewed A-146 Contractor's compaction grouting designs for two Type II structures.

For contract A-121, reviewed and approved Contractor's submittals for acoustical materials, HVAC data, ventilation fans, and miscellaneous metals for toilet areas. Approved as noted submittals for toilet partitions, concrete, mixes, highbay mounting details, and handrails. Rejected submittals for ceramic tiles and cabinet details.

<u>For Contract A-141</u>, reviewed and approved Certificate of Compliance for VCP pipe. Approved as noted submittals for excavation support system soldier piles designs, excavation support procedures, and temporary decking. Rejected a submittal for manholes.

For Contract A-145, reviewed and approved submittals for temporary decking (partial), electrical materials, non-shrink grout tests, welder qualifications, and Certificate of Compliance for lumber. Approved as noted submittals for temporary decking (partial), concrete formwork for vaults, rebar list for vault work, closure wall lift drawings for vault work, and electrical equipment. Rejected submittals for temporary decking details and plumbing material.

<u>For Contract A-146</u>, reviewed and approved Contractor's submittals for geotechnical instrumentation, adit support design, pre-cast concrete segments and tunnel instrumentation. Approved as noted submittals for gas detection instrumentation and deletion of tape extensometers.

<u>For Contract A-171</u>, reviewed and approved Contractor's submittals for geotechnical instrumentation and shaft access bridge. Approved as noted submittals for excavation support, gas detection instrumentation, deletion of tape extensometers, and tieback procedures.

<u>For Contract A-175</u>, reviewed and approved Contractor's submittals for geotechnical instrumentation, and Certificates of Compliance for VCP pipe. Approved as noted a submittal for lagging at bed rock. Started mapping exposed geology in the Wilshire/Grand underpinning pits in Contract A-146.

SAFETY/SECURITY: Performed daily Safety Surveillance and prepared reports for the A-121, A-141, A-145, A-146, A-161, A-171 and A-175 construction sites. At the A-146 site, a minor fire occurred in the Wilshire/Grand Building. Increasing crime in the A-145 and A-171 work areas has caused the respective contractors to substantially increase security.

MISCELLANEOUS: Assisted RTD in the resolution of community-related problems caused by Metro Rail construction and conducted contract compliance activities relative to Equal Opportunity goals at all of the construction sites.

MANPOWER PERFORMANCE

The manpower performance for September is measured against the approved planned staffing for the 4th AWP. During September, the permanent staff level of 111 increased by 5 to 116. The planned staff level for September was 117. Therefore, the actual permanent staff count for September is 1 below the planned staffing level. The staff breakdown by company was 71 for the Joint Venture firms and 45 for the Associate Subcontractors.

The September period had 152 available workhours/person. The plan provided for expenditure of 18,424 hours, including "as-required" manhours which would have generated a projected equivalent head count of 121.0 personnel at 152 hours/person. Actual hours expended were 16,402 which translates into a 108.0 equivalent head count at 152 hours/person including temporary personnel, resulting in the equivalent of 13.0 personnel under the revised plan.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY (EO) PERFORMANCE

EO performance in September measured under four categories - DBE, WBE and Minority and Women Affirmative Action, was as follows:

- o Cumulative DBE participation for the Fourth Annual Work Plan through the month, measured against a total cost basis was 16.1%, 0.9% under the goal of 17%. This was due to VCM's decertification as a DBE.
- o Cumulative WBE participation for the Fourth Annual Work Plan through the month, measured against a total cost basis was 5.4%, 2.4% over the goal of 3%.
- o Minority and Women Affirmative Action performance for the month exceeded the established goals of 17% and 8% by 16% and 6% respectively.

SCHEDULE PERFORMANCE

o <u>CM Manuals/Procedures</u> - The Emergency Response Plan, Revision No. 1 was finalized and issued to controlled manual holders.

o Constructibility Reviews - Started Constructibility Review of A-795/100% and completed review of A-130/60%.

Ocontractor Submittals - During this period, the following 97 submittals were received as per contract number: A-121 (14), A-141 (16), A-145 (43), A-146 (9), A-161 (1), A-171 (7), and A-175 (7); 80 packages were processed.

COST PERFORMANCE - Fourth Annual Work Plan

o Total incurred costs for CM Direct Services for the period were under the plan of \$880K by \$36K. This variance results from the net effect of other Direct Costs (ODCs) being over the plan by \$56K. Labor expenditures (total PDCD and subcontractors) being under the plan by \$92K.

o The September CPR indicates an estimate at completion for the 4th AWP of \$13,732K versus a budget of \$13,773,900, thereby projecting a potential underexpenditure of \$42K for the plan including General Condition Items.

GENERAL CONDITION ITEMS

General Condition Items (GCI's) were over the plan of \$10K for the period by \$30K. This report forecasts an estimate of completion for GCI's of \$639K versus a September plan of \$480K, for a projected overplan expenditure of \$159K.

During the period a letter was transmitted to RTD requesting that the budget for General Condition Items be increased to \$1,000,000 based on both current and projected levels of activity.

GENERAL

o This "Monthly <u>Contract</u> Performance Report" covers progress relative to PDCD's <u>CM Services</u> contract with the RTD. Each month, in conjunction with this report, a "Monthly <u>Construction</u> Performance Report" is prepared covering actual Metro Rail <u>construction</u> progress. The two reports in combination present a comprehensive review of the Metro Rail <u>Program's</u> progress and each should be referenced appropriately.

o The PDCD Joint Venture Executive Board (JVEB) Meeting No. 10 is scheduled for Friday, October 23, 1987.

II. MANPOWER PERFORMANCE

This CPR for the month of September compares actual manpower to the Planned Phase II Construction Services manpower as established in the approved 4th AWP. Table II-1, Page 6, illustrates planned staffing, actual permanent staff count for September; variances of actual permanent staff to planned and temporary staff.

During September, the actual permanent staff level of 111 had a net increase of 5 (Additions: 1 Communications R.E., 1 Sr. Structural Engineer, 1 Environmental Engineering Technician, 2 Engineering Geologists, 2 Inspectors; Deletions: 1 Manager, Facilities Construction, and 1 Sr. Data Technician, Document Control) for a total of 116. NOTE: Shop Drawing Coordinator was reassigned as Assoc. Inspec./Field Office Engr.; Jr. Estimator was reassigned as Shop Drawing Coordinator. The planned staff level for September was 117; therefore, the actual permanent staff count for September was 1 below the planned staffing level. The current permanent staff by company is as follows:

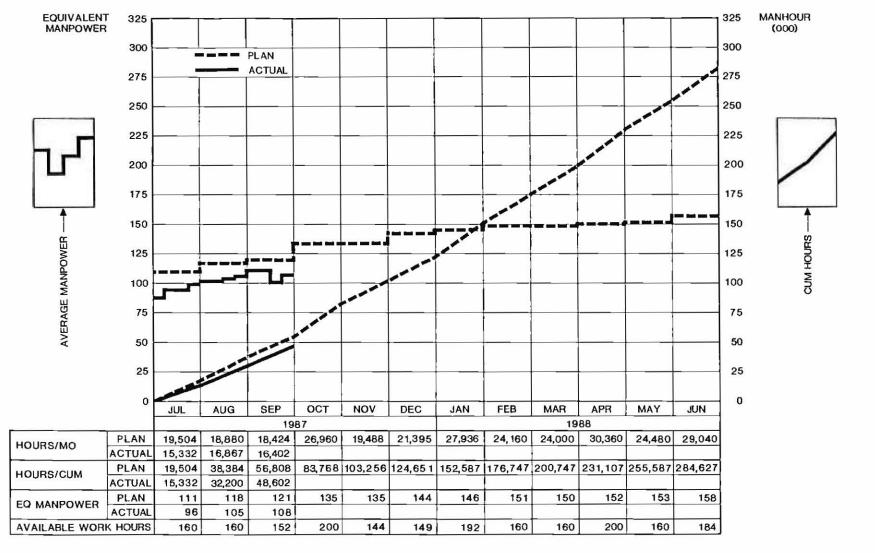

DBE Participation

The monthly DBE participation for the Fourth Annual Work Plan for September, measured on the basis of total cost was 16.9%, 0.1% below the 17% goal. The cumulative cost percent for the 4th Annual Work Plan was 16.1%, 0.9% below the 17% goal (Figure 1). This is due to the decertification of VCM as a DBE.

WBE Participation

The monthly WBE participation for the Fourth Annual Work Plan for September, measured on the basis of total cost was 6.2%, 2.2% above the 3% goal. The cumulative cost percent for the 4th Annual Work Plan was 5.4%, 2.4% above the 3% goal (Figure 2).

Affirmative Action Analysis

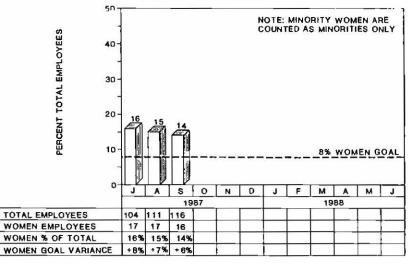


FIGURE 4 - WOMEN AFFIRMATIVE ACTION ANALYSIS

The Affirmative Action Analyses for minorities and women, as indicated in Figures 3 and 4, exceeds the established goals of 17% for minorities, and 8% for women by 16% and 6% respectively.

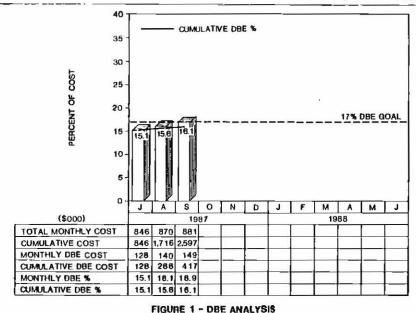

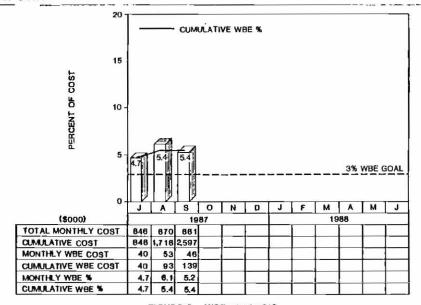

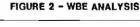

FOURTH ANNUAL WORK PLAN

Total incurred costs (Page 14) for CM Direct Services (without General Condition Items) for the period were under the plan of \$880K by \$36K. This variance results from the net effect of Other Direct Costs (ODCs) being over the plan by \$56K and Labor expenditures (total PDCD and subcontractors) being under the plan by \$92K.

The September CPR forecasts (Page 20) an estimate at completion of \$13,732K versus a Fourth Annual Work Plan of \$13,774K, for a projected underplan expenditure of \$42K including General Condition Items. Extracting the General Condition Items and reporting them separately, the September CPR forecasts a CM Direct Services estimate at completion of \$13,094K versus a plan of \$13,294K for an underplan expenditure of \$200K.

GENERAL CONDITION ITEMS

General Condition Items (GCI's) were over the plan of \$10K for the period by \$30K. This report forecasts an estimate at completion for GCI's of \$639K versus a September plan of \$480K, for a projected overplan expenditure of \$159K.

During the period a letter was transmitted to RTD requesting that the budget for General Condition Items be increased to \$1,000,000 based on both current and projected levels of activity.

LABOR COSTS

The average hourly labor rate, including burdens and fees, experienced for the period was \$43.36/hr. compared to a plan rate of \$43.60, resulting in a difference of \$0.24 per hour.

The labor cost variance for the period resulted from variances to the plan in staffing, rate variance, average labor rate, and manhours expended, as follows:

OTHER DIRECT COSTS

Other Direct Costs (ODCs) were over the plan for the period by a net of \$56K due to the following:

- 1. Office Expenses higher than planned expenses for outside reproduction.
- 2. Computer Operation Support overexpenditure due to higher than planned use of computers.
- 3. Vehicle and Maintenance overexpenditure due to higher than planned annual insurance premiums
- 4. Office Space underexpenditure due to escalation which did not materialize.
- 5. Relocation and Travel overexpenditure due to sooner than planned relocation charges.
- 6. Field Equipment overexpenditure of \$32,000 due to the purchase of environmental monitoring equipment. This equipment was originally planned to be purchased during AWP-3. The items were not budgeted in AWP-4. However, procurement approval by the District was not received until late July, 1987, subsequent to the inception of AWP-4.

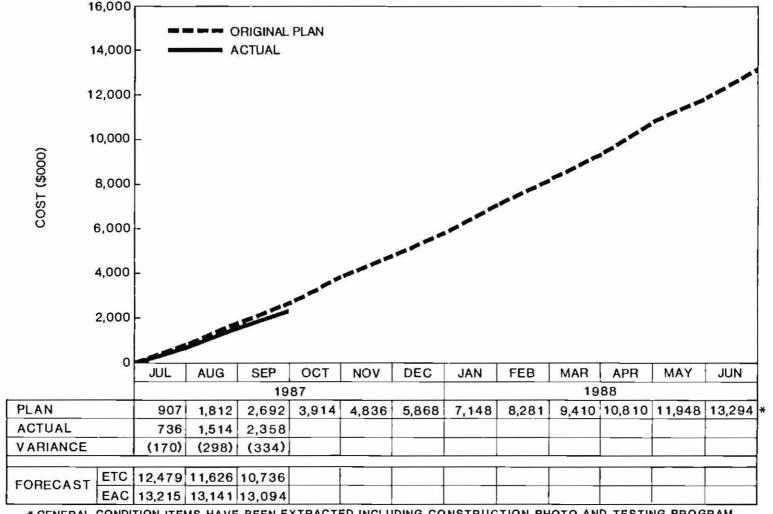

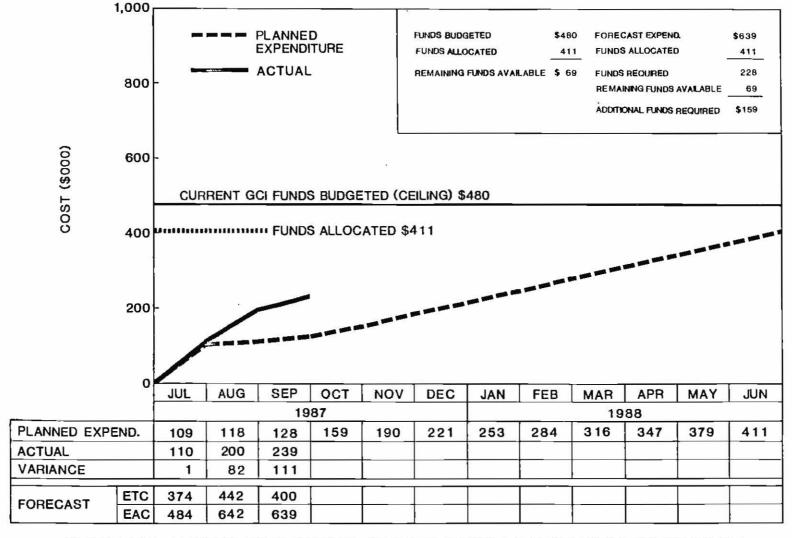
CM DIRECT SERVICES CUMULATIVE COST PERFORMANCE
