PUBLIC HEARINGS TO BE HELD DECEMBER 17 ON PROPOSED BUS CONNECTION CHANGES TO INTERFACE WITH METRO GREEN LINE

The MTA will hold two public hearings on Saturday, December 17 regarding proposed modifications to MTA bus routes near the I-105 to more directly serve the Green Line, which is scheduled to open in mid-1995.

The public hearings will be held at 10 a.m. at the Inglewood Library Lecture Hall, 101 West Manchester, in Inglewood, and at 2 p.m. at the Downey City Council Chambers, 11111 Brookshire Ave., in Downey.

The Green Line will operate from Norwalk to El Segundo, a distance of about 20 miles. Fourteen rail stations will be served along an east-west alignment. In preparation for the startup date, MTA staff has developed a draft transportation plan that, among other things, suggests new bus routes to be operated to promote greater public access to the Green Line.

Interested citizens are invited to attend these hearings and offer comments on the plan. Suggestions from the community will be taken into consideration by the MTA's Board of Directors before a final bus/rail interface plan is adopted early next year. Persons unable to attend the hearings may submit written testimony to the Board through December 17, the close of the public record. All correspondence should be addressed to:
