## MTA CREW COMPLETES TUNNEL BREAKTHROUGH AT WILSHIRE/VERMONT

- WHAT: A giant tunneling machine will break through a wall of dirt at Vermont Avenue and Wilshire Boulevard, breaching the last barrier in the tunnel linking Wilshire and Hollywood Boulevards.
- WHEN: Thursday, June 23, 1994 10:00 a.m.
- WHERE: The site of the Wilshire/Vermont Red Line station, at the corner of Wilshire Boulevard and Vermont Avenue
- PARTICIPANTS: MTA Chairman Richard Alatorre MTA CEO Frank White RCC President Ed McSpedon
- VISUALS: A rare opportunity for access to a Red Line subway station under construction. From "track level" in the station, view workers, the tunnel and station, and the 250 ton tunnelling machine pushing aside a wall of dirt, extending the tunnel from Hollywood into the station. Note: For safety reasons, women participants must wear slacks, and flat, hard-soled shoes are required for all.
- **DIRECTIONS:** From downtown, take Wilshire Boulevard West to Vermont Avenue, turn north and proceed one half block. Parking will be in lot on the West side of the street.
