MTA TO DISCUSS CHANGES IN BUS SERVICE TO PROVIDE CONNECTIONS TO THE GREEN LINE;

COMMUNITY MEETINGS TO BE HELD IN WILLOWBROOK, LYNWOOD, NORWALK, EL SEGUNDO AND HAWTHORNE

The Metro Green Line is scheduled to open in mid-1995 and with it will come some changes in MTA bus operations. To discuss possible bus service modifications and the creation of shuttle services, the MTA is inviting South Bay and Southeast area residents to attend special community meetings.

The Metro Green Line is an extension of the Los Angeles Metro Rail System currently under construction by the MTA. The Green Line will span 20 miles from Norwalk to El Segundo and will have 14 stations.

Stations are located at the I-605/I-105 freeways, Lakewood/I-105, Long Beach/I-105, Imperial/Wilmington, Avalon/I-105, Harbor Freeway/I-105, Vermont/I-105, Crenshaw/I-105, Hawthorne/I-105, Aviation/I-105, Mariposa/Nash, El Segundo/Nash, Douglas/Rosecrans and Marine/I-405. Passengers will be able to connect to the Long Beach-Los Angeles Metro Blue Line at the Imperial/Wilmington Station.
