STATEMENT IN RESPONSE TO TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER FROM MTA DEPUTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER KIM KIMBALL

Because of the serious financial and operational implications of not implementing MTA's new fare structure as scheduled, the MTA has requested a stay of United States District court Judge Terry Hatter's temporary restraining order issued earlier in the day that orders MTA to roll back its new fare structure.

Until Judge Hatter rules on MTA's request for the stay, MTA bus operators will be instructed to collect \$1.10 for the base fare. Monthly passes will be distributed to selected sales outlets throughout Los Angeles County as quickly as possible.
