## MURALS BY LOS ANGELES ARTIST STUART VAUGHAN TO BE DEDICATED AT HOLLYWOOD RED LINE CONSTRUCTION SITE

WHAT:	Artist Stuart Vaughan's twin murals, entitled "Digging the Red Line," will be officially dedicated at the Red Line construction site at Barnsdall Park in Hollywood. The mural, which is part of the mitigation effort during the subway construction project, depicts a cross-section view of the tunneling, with painted images of construction workers, equipment, passengers, and even a wedding party to symbolize the union of Metro Rail and the Barnsdall Art Park being created at the site.
