## MTA UNVEILS NEW GENERATION OF RED LINE RAIL CAR

WHAT: The MTA has taken delivery of the first two new rail cars for the Metro

Red Line. They will be unwrapped at the Red Line Maintenance Yard and begin five months of testing. These cars are similar in appearance to the

current fleet of 30 Red Line vehicles, but have AC electric motors.

improved brakes and are lighter than the original model. They will be fully

compatible with existing Red Line facilities. A total of 74 cars will be

WHY: The MTA is expanding its fleet of Red Line rail cars to meet the

demands of increasing passenger loads and a growing rail system. The

Wilshire Corridor of the Metro Red Line opened last July, and the

Vermont Avenue and Hollywood Boulevard segments are scheduled to

open at the end of 1998. Daily ridership is 35,000 per day.

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
