MTA TO HOLD WORKSHOPS SEEKING COMMUNITY INPUT ON THE DESIGN OF PASADENA BLUE LINE'S CHINATOWN STATION

WHAT:

The MTA will hold two community meetings in the next two weeks to provide the public with the opportunity to comment on the design for the Metro Rail station to be constructed in Chinatown as part of the Pasadena Blue Line project. MTA design and construction staff will be joined by architect Kevin Peterson and artist Chusien Chang who will discuss the the potential themes which could be incorporated into the station design, including the Chinese I-Ching. Following presentations, community members will break into small groups where they'll be asked what elements they would like to see in the design to create a station that is both functional and aesthetically pleasing, and one that blends well with the historic neighborhood.

An English/Cantonese interpreter will be present. Refreshments will be served.
