MTA HONORS SOUTH GATE BUSINESSMAN WITH 'ADOPT-A-BUS-STOP' COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

- WHAT: John P. (Papa) Maloney, owner of Maloney Meats in South Gate, will be honored by the MTA with an engraved plaque for his exemplary service to the community and for having inspired the idea for the 'adopt-a-bus-stop' program.
