ROSA PARKS, MOTHER OF THE MODERN CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT, TO BE HONORED

- WHAT: Rosa Parks will be honored for her contribution to the cause of racial equality. Officials will unveil an artist's rendering of a bronze plaque which will be installed at a later date. In 1955, Ms. Parks' refusal to surrender her seat on a Montgomery, Alabama bus sparked a 381-day boycott of that city's bus system and a wave of similar non-violent protests across the nation. The dedication was spearheaded by MTA's African-American Employees Association and L.A. County Supervisor Yvonne Brathwaite Burke.
