It's Getting Better on the Bus MTA TO UPDATE MEDIA ON METRO BUS OVERHAUL

WHAT: A year ago MTA officials gave reporters this assessment of the

Metro Bus system: "we got the message, it's broke so fix it." A spate of new buses, more service on the road, and better supervision are easing overcrowding and improving passenger comfort. Complaints are down. Performance indicators are up. Metro Bus service is even safer thanks to policing by LAPD and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. Still, MTA has a ways to

go before the bus system is where it should be. LA. County Supervisor and new MTA Board Chair Yvonne Brathwaite Burke, MTA officials, law enforcement officials, bus operators and bus riders will update media on progress made during the past year to revamp the Metro Bus fleet and chart continuing remedial efforts.
