SUBWAY PASSENGERS ENCOURAGED TO STATION HOP
THIS WEEKEND WHEN METRO RED LINE OPENS IN HOLLYWOOD

The MTA, doing its best impression of Ed Sullivan this weekend, June 12 and 13, has scheduled a festival of shows and other fun-filled activities at Metro Rail subway stations opening on Vermont Avenue and Hollywood Boulevard.

All entertainment, Saturday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday, 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., and travel this weekend on the entire subway system will be free, however, fare still will be collected on the Metro Blue and Green lines and all MTA buses.

Besides the main headliner, the 4.6 mile extension of the subway to Hollywood, there will something for everyone at the grand opening celebration, including kids and "Trekkies," who can enjoy the sounds of Neil Norman and his Cosmic Orchestra. The group, accompanied by Tim Russ, who plays Tuvok on "Voyager," will play the theme music from "Star Trek" and other spin-off series.

In addition to out-of this-world music, among the entertainers who will maintain the excitement will be dance acts, El Chicano with Mickey Lespron, Bloodstone, Sandra Lear Swing Dance Band, and Brandy backup singer Justine.

Also at the grand opening will be display booths, including "Space Muppets" and various exhibits, face-painting, a soccer demonstration, an auto display, balloon crafts and look-alike celebrities. There also will be opportunities to win t-shirts, CDs and movie tickets. In addition, visitors can choose from a wide selection of cuisine, including BBQ, and refreshments.
