HOMEBOYS LOST JOBS IN BAKERY FIRE

MTA HIRES HOMEBOYS TO BEAUTIFY EASTSIDE PROPERTY; MTA AND PROYECTO PASTORAL NONPROFIT GROUP TO MARK START OF WORK WHAT: MTA, Proyecto Pastoral and North East Trees will announce the beginning of the Beautification Project for three MTA Eastside properties as part of their efforts to maintain and upkeep those Eastside properties. The work to be done will be fencing and landscaping. Proyecto Pastoral is a nonprofit organization which trains and employs at-risk youth from the Eastside community. The project will cost \$134,640. The labor will be provided by Homeboy Industries, whose members lost their jobs in the Oct. 29 Homeboy Bakery fire. The design of the fence and landscaping was done by North East Trees. The locations are: Soto St. & César Chávez Ave; First St. and Boyle Ave; First St. and Lorena St. The properties were bought to built an Eastside Metro Rail Line subway extension, however, the project to the Eastside was suspended by the MTA Board of Directors in 1998. A study is underway to consider what should be done with the land.
