NEW BROCHURE NOW AVAILABLE HIGHLIGHTS LA'S BRIGHTEST SPOTS SERVED BY METRO RAIL

With the opening of the North Hollywood extension of the Metro Red Line planned later this year, MTA has developed a new brochure highlighting major destination points along the entire Metro Rail system.

The new brochure, "Take Metro Rail to LA's Brightest Spots," includes a map of the entire Metro Rail system which includes the Metro Blue Line from Long Beach to downtown Los Angeles, the Metro Green Line from Norwalk to Redondo Beach and the Metro Red Line subway from Union Station in Los Angeles through Hollywood to the San Fernando Valley.

When the North Hollywood Extension of the Metro Red Line opens in mid-2000, it will add 6.3-miles to the Metro Rail system bringing the total to nearly 60 miles of rail serving major destination points throughout the region including the heart of Hollywood, Universal City and the NoHo Arts District.

Points of interest currently served by Metro Rail include Chinatown, Olvera Street, Union Station, various downtown museums, hotels, theaters and shopping plazas.

In Hollywood, Metro Rail now serves such major tourist attractions as the world famous Hollywood Walk of Fame, Pantages Theater, Los Angeles Community College and various hospitals.

The North Hollywood Extension of the Metro Red Line, when opened this summer, will serve the Hollywood Bowl, Mann's Chinese Theater, the Universal Amphitheater, Universal CityWalk, Universal Studios, the NoHo Arts District and the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences.
