MTA ANNOUNCED EXTENDED LATE NIGHT HOURS FOR METRO RAIL

WHAT:

MTA joins the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce and individuals representing businesses and entertainment venues near Metro Rail stations to announce the expansion of late-night service hours for the Metro Rail system. The expansion of service will aid employees as well as those individuals attending events at entertainment venues like Staples Center, various theaters in Hollywood, CityWalk or Universal Studios in the San Fernando Valley. Metro Rail spans nearly 60 miles from Long Beach to downtown Los Angeles, to Norwalk and El Segundo, Hollywood and Universal City and North Hollywood. A full hour will be added to the late-night schedules on the Metro Blue Line and between 40 minutes to an hour will be added to the last train on the Metro Red Line subway system.
