METRO RED LINE SUBWAY THE RIGHT CONNECTION FOR VISITING NORTH HOLLYWOOD HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ON ASSIGNMENT

WHAT:

The Metro Red Line will be the transportation mode of choice for as many as 200 North Hollywood High School students who will travel to Hollywood on L.A's sleek and fast subway to attend a special screening of a documentary at the Egyptian Theatre as part of a class assignment. Times past, to transport students the school would have had to lease two or more buses at a much greater cost. With the development of the Metro Rail system, students, schools and many other organizations and groups in the Los Angeles area are discovering the ease of travel and connections on the Metro Red, Blue and Green Lines.

Enrolled in North Hollywood High's transportation academy, the students will join 75 students from Hollywood High School's New Media Academy for the screening of Penelope Spheeris' "Decline of Western Civilization." Prior to the screening, the students will hear a presentation about the importance of the Metro Red Line to transportation in Los Angeles.
