Measure M-Funded Project

L.A. Metro to Hold Community Meetings in November for L.A. River Path Project

The Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) invites the public to a series of community open house meetings in November for the L.A. River Path Project, a high-priority eight-mile, shared-use bicycle and pedestrian path extension through downtown Los Angeles and the City of Vernon. Interested members of the community can learn about the project's early concepts for the path and provide their input.

The \$365 million Measure M-funded project seeks to close an existing gap in the Los Angeles River Bike Path and Greenway Trail, providing the region with a seamless 32-mile bicycle and pedestrian route from the San Fernando Valley to Long Beach. This eight-mile area represents the largest remaining gap in the greater 51-mile L.A. River Path system.

Content will be the same at all meetings. The Open Houses will be held at the following locations:
