L.A. Metro, Filmmaker Hervé Cohen to present new "Life Underground" Web Documentary Series at Los Angeles Union Station

WHAT:	In celebration of the Metro Red Line's 25th birthday this year, the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) will partner with filmmaker Hervé Cohen to present "Life Underground," an immersive art media installation and interactive web documentary at Los Angeles Union Station January 30 to February 5. The temporary exhibition will feature subway rider stories from across the globe, inviting visitors on a journey through the subways of the world and the personal stories of their riders. L.A.'s Metro Red Line is one of only 13 international subway systems featured in the exhibition, and is the only U.S. subway system included. The unique stories of four local Metro riders will be presented in this series.
