## Measure M, SB 1-Funded Project

## L.A. Metro to Break Ground on Metro Orange Line Improvements Project

WHAT: Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) officials

will announce the groundbreaking for the Metro Orange Line

Improvements Project, a new Measure M and SB-1 funded initiative that will improve bus speeds, safety and prepare the San Fernando Valley's premier Bus Rapid Transit Line for future conversion to light rail. Metro plans to build aerial bridges and stations at Van Nuys and Sepulveda Boulevards as well as install four-quadrant crossing gates at up to 35 busway intersections between North Hollywood and Chatsworth.
