L.A. Metro to Hold Media Conference Call on New Unsolicited Proposals Innovation Forum Series Focused on Improving Traffic

of forums designed to harness the ingenuity of private sector innovators and entrepreneurs to solve some of L.A. County's most pressing transportation challenges. The Metro Accelerator Forum Series will kick off December 4 with the challenge topic, "Think You Can Solve Traffic?," with panel discussions on using incentives to get more people to consider alternatives to driving or to avoid driving during peak periods and how to use congestion pricing (tolled highway facilities) to ease traffic in L.A. transportation wonks, to name a few.
