Metro Bus Service Delays/Detours Due to Dodger Celebrations

Due to a number of public celebrations occurring in and around downtown Los Angeles as a result of the Dodgers winning the World Series, Metro bus service may be delayed in certain areas. Some street closures due to the celebrations have impacted several Metro bus lines. Those lines being detoured around the closures include:

Lines 18, 720 (Whittier Boulevard, Eastern Avenue & Atlantic Boulevard)

Lines 60, 115, 117 & 760 (Long Beach Boulevard, Tweedy Boulevard & Santa Ana Street)

Lines 28, 30, 33, 81, 460, 728 & 910 (Downtown Los Angeles)

Lines 60, 110, 251, 254, 751 & 760 (Pacific Boulevard, Florence Avenue, Slauson Avenue, Gage Avenue, Santa Fe Avenue and State Street)

Line 2, 4 & 704 Sunset Boulevard, Figueroa Street & Alvarado Street.

Metro's rail system is currently operating without any service delays resulting from the celebrations. Rail service is currently operating every 20 minutes.
