217	Hollywood Blvd Fairfax Ave.	Reduce weekday frequency of service from 6 to 15 minutes during peak and 10 to 30 minutes during non- peak hours. End service at Hollywood and Vine Red Line Station.	Support: 1 Oppose: 14	 Supports converting local to Rapid bus service. Oppose the proposal, as patrons will have to transfer to complete trip. Ending service at Vine will eliminate the only direct connection on Fairfax to hospitals on Vermont and Sunset. 	Staff recommends a weekday frequency of 8 minutes during peak hours and 16 minutes during non-peak hours. Retain existing service to Sunset and Vermont.
787	Fairfax Ave Hollywood Blvd. - Glendale - Pasadena	Establish new Rapid Bus service along the Fairfax Ave., Hollywood Blvd., and Colorado corridors.	Support: 8 Oppose: 2	 Support the proposal for faster service from West L.A. to Glendale and South Pasadena. Oppose the replacement of local service with the Rapid service. 	Staff recommends implementation of the new Rapid service as previously approved by the MTA Board. The proposed frequency of service is 10 minutes during peak hours and 15 minutes during non-peak hours.
