

METRO TRANSIT SERVICE POLICY UPDATE

BACKGROUND

- Policy adopted in September 2003.
- Guides decision-making during the service change process.
- Four main sections: design guidelines, performance measures, rail policies, and planning process.
- Annual review and update.
- Will Go to Metro Board in January 2005.

KEY THEMES OF EXISTING POLICY

- Focus on regional services.
- Provide 30 minute policy headways.
- Implement a Mystery Rider Program.
- Use Performance Index to trigger corrective actions for poorly performing bus routes.

PROGRESS SINCE LAST YEAR

- Rapid Lines increased from 7 to 9, and directly operated shuttles increased from 5 to 7.
- Lines that operate with peak hour trunk headway greater than 30 minutes increased from 35 lines to 38 lines.
- Mystery Rider Program now back on track.
- Corrective actions have been programmed on 75% of the poorly performing bus routes and several services were canceled due to poor performance.
