Overview

- 2001 LRTP anticipated Call for Projects every two years
- A Call has not been held since 2001
- Competitive process cities and transportation agencies eligible to apply
- Programs available federal, state and local funds over six-year period from FY 08 – 2013
 - mostly starting in 2009 and beyond



Why Metro Uses The "Call"

- Metro is required to prepare a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
 - TEA-21, SAFETEA-LU and SB 45
- One of Metro's multi-modal programming responsibilities
- Implements Long and Short Range Transportation Plans
