






Line 30/31 & Gold Line Extension

Summary of Recommendations

Connectivity	 Little Tokyo is the primary downtown access. Line 30/730 will provide distribution along Broadway. Dual Hub BRT will provide distribution in Bunker Hill. Various SGV changes to serve GL stations, particularly at Indiana and Atlantic/Pomona Stops. Connection to ELAC via existing services.
Duplication	1) Reduce Line 30 service duplication along 1st from Alameda to Indiana.
Access	1) Maintain service on Floral and 1st with extensions of existing lines.
Resources	Bus resource neutral/savings by 1) Reduce service on 1 st between Alameda and Indiana. 2) Reduce service on Floral and 1 st east of Indiana. 3) Possible increase in N/S feeder service.






Gold Line Interface – All Stations


